Environmental Stability

Look in the shops at the food, kitty litter and parasite prevention medications you wish to use and start to factor it into your budget. At Jasmarez, we use the brands below and, while you don't have to keep to the same, be wary of tummy upsets post-relocation from the stress and diet change. Your kitten will come with some food to ease the transition.

Litter – Sieve style tray with bottom tray lined with a plastic litter tray liner, a blue absorbent pad like the puppy training pads, sprinkled with tray fragrance, then in the top layer we use recycled paper pellets.

Food – Dry Kibble is a mixture of Super Coat and Royal Canin. Wet food is either a beef mince or a roo mince mixed with all vets complete mix. Treats range from chicken wing tips to necks, hearts and eggs.

Vaccinations – mostly F4, in some cases I will vaccinate with F5 and FIV. To be discussed with family dependant on living requirements.

Parasite control – I use a “Spot-On” medication such as Revolution or Advocate for cats every month and for intestinal worms, I use an all-wormer like Dontral or ParaGard.
